






Our Little Food Pantry Has New Hours:

They are working alongside staff to help this ministry continue to feed the community. Donations are always appreciated. Just leave items on the floor by the pantry or by Suzette's office so we can sort and date them. Donations to our Good Shepherd fund are also appreciated. We will take this money and shop for needed items, helping to keep the food pantry well stocked with popular items.



The Good Shepherd Fund

Did you know we have a "Good Shepherd Fund" at Indian Heights UMC? This fund was established several years ago when we realized there was a need from the community for a special fund that helps pay for things like utility bills, rent, food, car repairs, and more. The money

in this fund is being focused on our Little Food Pantry right now, but can be used for other things as needs arise. You can give cash or check, or give via our website. Please note the fund this is for with your payment.



Dave Schnackenberg began studying the piano at age seven and has continued throughout the past 61 years. He began playing for worship services at age 12 and has been playing in the church ever since. For several decades Dave worked as a composer, arranger and pianist with Artists of Indian America out of Albuquerque, NM. In 2018 one of his compositions was performed in Carnegie Hall, NYC.

Dave has also performed solo and duo piano concerts throughout a seven-state region. Most of those concerts were for charitable organizations or to aid people facing medical situations. He has enjoyed bringing sacred and classical piano music to people. Soli Deo Gloria – to God be the Glory – is the backbone

of each concert as he truly believes that, what talent he has, was given by God.

He also taught music for 41 years with the Bureau of Indian Education on the Turtle Mt. Chippewa reservation in Belcourt, ND, becoming an honorary member within the tribe. He then spent four years teaching in the public school system before retiring from education in 2023. Dave has also been the pianist for two community musical theatre groups since 2008 and has accompanied 40+ Missoula Children's Theatre productions, which is a group that brings theatre into schools across the nation and around the globe. In 2010 Dave also began recording music digitally for use in worship services, to provide music for churches who are without musicians.

Currently Dave is the full-time lay pastor for the Presbyterian churches of Rolla and St. John in North Dakota. This concert is Dave's way of thanking God for all He has done. May you feel His love through this performance.
