Dear Siblings in Christ,

We are a few days away from the Nehemiah Assembly being held by the members of the Good Faith Network. The Nehemiah Assembly is a time that the people of Johnson County will be coming together seeking justice for those in our community who are hurting. People experiencing a mental health crisis, people who are homeless, and those who can not afford housing in the community they live and work in.

Did you know that there are currently almost 300 people unhoused in our county? That 40% of the people who WORK for Johnson County cannot afford to live in Johnson County? And that nearly 8,000 people seek emergency care for a mental health episode every year? Change is needed. Justice is needed. YOU are needed to stand up for all of these people and more.

The Good Faith Network will gather over 1,500 people across three faith traditions seeking justice. When there is people power, justice can not be ignored.

Our faith calls us to seek justice and to change the systems in place. Recently, I have been intrigued by the good trouble that Jesus and the prophets got into: turning over tables, disrupting the systems in place and seeking radical change.

As followers of Christ, we are called to seek justice. We are called to work with one another in a community where all people know their worth and feel valued. We can do that together with the Good Faith Network.

The Good Faith Network will be asking County Commissioners and Tim DeWeese, Executive Director of Johnson County Mental Health, to commit to making change in our community. We can no longer keep placing Band-Aids over the issues in front of us, but to do what the Lord requires.

IHUMC is part of the Good Faith Network and you are invited to come to the Nehemiah Assembly and see what this is all about. The event will be held at Church of The Resurrection at 6:00pm on May 7. COR's address is 13720 Roe Blvd, Leawood, KS. Tickets are free and you can get one from one of our team leaders and/or Pastor Ali, they use the tickets to track numbers and church involvement.

Show up.

Seek Justice and tell the people of our county that they are worthy of love, respect and equality.

Let justice roll.



Summer Choir

Parkwood Day School Updates

I wanted to take a moment to give you all updates on what is happening with Parkwood Day School. Parkwood will officially be moving over to IHUMC on June 1st. As most projects go, the inside of the house (our old parsonage) is taking longer than expected. Our One Board had initially approved for Parkwood to use four classrooms in the church until the addition is built. Due to the amount of work being done, they are unsure if the classrooms in the house will be ready by June 1. With that being said, the One Board has approved additional, temporary use of our Fellowship Hall for the preschool to use until the rooms in the house are ready. So what does that mean?

Beginning June 1, the church will be the primary location for the school. All groups impacted by this have been notified and arrangements are being made to accommodate all. The school meets Monday-Friday, from 7am-6pm.

Once the 5 classrooms are done inside the house, the majority of the kids will move over there, hopefully by the end of summer. Parkwood will still rent 4 classrooms, as initially planned, from IHUMC until the addition is completed. Then all children will move over to the house and use the church building for big group activities as agreed upon already.

Parkwood has graciously offered to do the following updates to the church:

- New flooring, paint, and dividers in the fellowship hall
- New doors going out of the fellowship hall onto the playground
- New playground equipment
- Landscaping around the church, labyrinth, and garden

Change is coming and we all know change can add stress. However, I want us to all welcome this change with generous and excited spirits! While this was not the full original plan, we are in this with Parkwood and have to be willing to adapt as necessary. This partnership is wonderful for our church family, and I truly believe it will only continue to strengthen.

Youth Group News


Last fall we created a group for youth, 4th grade and older. We meet in a lower level classroom at 9:30 Sunday mornings. We've completed a 12-week study of the Bible that took us from the creation story to the beginning of the early Church. We've learned about the Church calendar, completed an Advent study and Lenten study, dug into the four gospels, shared two large tubs of cheese balls, and gotten to know each other better. We're finding and reading scripture together, sometimes we don't even need our bookmarks to find the scripture! We'll take a break for the summer and spend time in service each month. Next fall, we'll begin a study "A United Methodist Is…" which will be a great introduction to Wesleyan theology and a primer for confirmation.

Memorial Day Remembrance Garden

When Memorial Day comes, we think of taking flowers to the graves of our family and friends but may not be near enough to these sites to do so. In 1987, Indian Heights UMC began the tradition of creating a Memorial Day Remembrance Garden where you may place a flower in memory of your loved ones. The Remembrance gift you give may be any amount and will be a lasting gift that will keep on giving through the years.

On Sunday, May 19 and May 26, artificial flowers will be available after worship to place on a bulletin board display to remember your loved ones and the display will be left up until after Memorial Day. You can place flowers on the bulletin boards along with the name of the person honoree and your name. If the honoree was a veteran, please also place a flag on the card. Donations to the Memorial Garden can be made as Designated Funds or to the Memorial Endowment Fund, which permanently grows. The principal is never spent, and only the interest created can be used for church projects.

Items the Memorial fund has purchased over the years include our Advent candle holder and accessories, card tables, altar candlesticks, the labyrinth, Bibles, hymnals, chimes, sign on 103rd & Nall, candle lighter, cross and flame signage, the Church Office computer, 50th anniversary celebration, Quilts of Valor materials, and the projection/sound system in the Sanctuary.

We hope you enjoy our "garden" and that it makes your Memorial Day more memorable.




