

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Our fall stewardship campaign "Transmitting the Light" is underway! The inspiration for this year's campaign comes from the stained-glass windows in the sanctuary. The windows were designed and put in the church over 30 years ago and hold significance not only to our faith, but to members of the church as well. When the designs were chosen, church members were given the option to sponsor a window in memory or honor of someone. Each window has a story, and this fall we will share those stories together.

Matthew 5: 14-16 reads:

"You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hid. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven".

The light that shines through the glass of the church reflects the light of Christ that is in each of us as we go out into the world and share the Good News. As members of the United Methodist Church, you made a commitment to support the church through your prayers, presence, service, gifts and witness. The gifts given to the church help to support the

ministries, staff, discipleship, events and everyday operations that take place. Your support is what allows the church to continue to grow the Kingdom of God right here and now.

I pray that each of you will join us for worship during this campaign and see how the light of Christ is transmitted in your life and the life of the church. 
Our Little Food Pantry

The 1st Saturday of every month, from 9-11am (during Baby Grace)


Mondays - Wednesdays 10am-2pm
