righteousness now and forever".




### **Advent Study**

# Johnson County IHN News

I am sad to report that Indian Heights UMC will no longer be serving the homeless through JOCO IHN.

At one time, this organization had 25 area churches involved, where 180,522 meals were served, 60,174 bed nights were provided, 927 individual (531 of those were children) were assisted, most of them going on to independent living.

IHUMC was a support church for Grace Presbyterian. We took in dinner, visited with the guests, entertained the children for two evenings of their host week which was four times a year.

Right after the Covid epidemic, church attendance was down in most churches in

the area, therefore, volunteers were also scarce. Churches started leaving the program. Recently, when they were down to just two churches that were hosting the guests overnight, IHN started a new model of sending the homeless to motels and giving them gift cards for food. The plan is that this model will continue until next summer. The area churches will no longer be involved.

Some of IHUMC members have served this Social Outreach for 15 years. Others joined later. I am so sorry that those of you who recently trained did not get to experience more of this rewarding Outreach. We so appreciate all of you that gave of your time, resources, and dedication to this program. We hope that

## Meet Alexis Merry, Our New Worship Leader

How did you get into worship leading? You could say that my first experiences leading worship began during my undergraduate studies at Pepperdine University. Our chamber choir would mainly sing sacred choral pieces, and this opened my eyes to the amount of spiritual food we can offer to audiences as musicians. My first official position leading worship was for a Nondenominational church in Spring, Texas in 2020. Since moving to Overland Park, I have led soprano sections for many churches in the area, including Methodist, Lutheran, Christian Church Disciples of Christ, and Anglican.

What do you love about worship leading? I changed dramatically when I realized I could combine my love for singing with my love for Jesus in worship leading. No longer would I have to be concerned with all of the performative nuances required for my opera career. I could simply let down my walls and let my authentic voice out to help encourage others that they can, too. And I finally felt a sense of purpose in the church and amid a congregation. I love singing almost all genres of vocal music, from sacred to secular. But I treasure singing worship music.

Where did you grow up? How did you end up in KC? I was born in Houston, Texas, and lived internationally until I was well over 18. My family moved to Italy when I was 10 years old, where I first experienced European life and learned a new language. From there, we would go on to live in Wales and London, England, and eventually move to Jakarta, Indonesia, where I would graduate high school. All throughout my life I have been a singer. My first ever role was Mr. Walt Disney himself in Walt Disney the Musical Jr. in 3rd Grade (mustache and top hat included!). By my senior year in Asia, I knew that making a career out of singing was my goal, and Pepperdine University in California was the only college to accept me based on a virtual audition.



From there, my teacher would go on to recommend me to another teacher who was based here, in Kansas City. Funny how I ended up getting my Master's in Opera Performance in Walt's very own home state! I recently graduated with my MM in 2023, and finished a 2-year apprenticeship with the Lyric Opera of Kansas City.

What is your favorite worship song? I have an entire playlist of my favorite worship songs that I constantly listen to on Spotify, so this is a tough one! Right now my top three are:

- Revelations 19:1 by Sunday Service Choir
- One Name (Jesus) Live by Naomi Raine
- Belong To You (Enemy Can't) Live by Here Be Lions

What do you hope to see for worship at **IHUMC?** IHUMC is one of the warmest churches I have ever set foot in! It reminds me a lot of my first WL position in Texas. We all became very much of a church family, and I was able to interact with the congregation in a way that would allow me to get song requests from anyone. I was a one-woman show there, so being a part of such a fantastic team of people and musicians here is beyond a blessing. I hope for us to grow closer and more confident in our praise and prayer songs. I believe these to be sacred times for us to speak to God with our hearts through music. My experience leading worship for so many different denominations has taught me that every congregation needs its own very specially tailored musical formula, and I hope to be able to join IHUMC's unique voice alongside you all.
